

# Lupus Ontario ANNUAL REPORT

Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 2023






During 2023, we gradually recovered from our locked-in COVID19 pandemic experience and started to once again participate at in-person events. Our events and support group programs were delivered in both a virtual and in-person manner as our immunocompromised community enthusiastically emerged from Covid hibernation. Our joy at being able to gather was showcased at the 2023 WALK for Lupus as the community turned up in huge numbers to support the WALK resulting in extremely successful multiple WALKS across the province therefore surpassing preset goals and raising an incredible \$157,263 for all our programs. The Italian Dinner Dance was still limited by COVID-19 and continued as an online Silent Auction, raising an incredible \$22,955. We are also grateful to everyone who held third party events such as Hope Volleyball Toronto, 90's Dance, Research Fellowship Fundraiser and Ottawa Door-to-Door to raise awareness and funds for lupus. Other non-event-based income sources contributing to revenue included bequests, investment income, memorial and charity donations.

Thanks to the generosity of donors, sponsors and grantors we were able to increase our support for all programs. Research programs funded increased to \$168,385 and included The Geoff Carr Fellowship, The Lupus Ontario Anne Matheson Biobank at the McMaster University Lupus Clinic, The Dr. Murray Urowitz Chair in Lupus Research at the University of Toronto and funding for the six accredited Lupus Clinics. All projects support research by investigating better methods of managing lupus or gathering data for research so that someday we have a Life Without Lupus. Our Geoff Carr Fellow last year was Dr. Stephanie Wong who completed her lupus clinical experience and research project at SickKids Hospital in Toronto. Her project was "Therapeutic drug monitoring of Hydroxychloroquine (HCQ) is feasible in the childhood SLE population, allowing for individualized HCQ treatment with optimal efficacy and prevention of long-term toxicity". She is now practising at Alberta Children's Hospital in Calgary to serve the pediatric lupus community!

From an Education, Awareness and Support perspective, we continued our online support groups and presented valuable educational information through our webinars, podcasts, newsletters and Annual Education Symposium. Through on line programming we were able to serve people living throughout Ontario as well as those living out of province and from all over the world. We increased our advocacy efforts by continuing to forge new partnerships with other organizations, helped improve medical care in northern Ontario and filed with the Canadian Agency for Drugs and Technologies in Health (CADTH) for new biologics for lupus patients.



Funds raised for the year increased, which allowed increases to all our support programs. Total spent on programs and expenses for the 2022 – 2023 year was \$458,972, an increase of \$43,601 over the prior year with most of the increase going towards Research & Clinic Support and the balance going to other Support programs. Expenditures on Administration and Fundraising Expenses decreased over the prior year.

### LOOKING FORWARD

We look forward with increased optimism as we realize that research in this area is escalating dramatically with multiple clinical trials under away by various pharmaceutical companies, leading to greater hope for a cure or an improvement in the quality of life for lupus patients. In the meantime, our plans for the coming year include more in person events which will allow us to better increase awareness and understanding of the impacts of lupus on patients, their families and the community in general.

I would like to thank all our sponsors, donors and dedicated staff and volunteers. Without your generosity we could not continue to provide high quality programs for the Ontario lupus community. Your commitment and dedication to improving life for the lupus community is outstanding and we sincerely thank you.


Lupus Ontario is the largest Canadian provincial organization focused on improving the lives of lupus patients and their families.

# 2022 - 2023 LUPUS ONTARIO GEOFF CARR FELLOW

Dr. Stephanie Wong earned her Doctor of Medicine degree at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver. Subsequently, she pursued a clinical fellowship in Pediatric Rheumatology at BC Children's Hospital. As a Geoff Carr Fellow, she gained clinical experience at SickKids Hospital, focusing on a dedicated SLE Clinic with a multidisciplinary approach. Additionally, she attended transition clinics at Mount Sinai and Toronto Western, as well as the Neonatal Lupus Clinic at SickKids twice monthly.

Her research focused on Hydroxychloroquine Blood Concentration in Childhood-onset SLE (cSLE), aiming to explore the feasibility of therapeutic drug monitoring of HCQ in this population for personalized treatment with optimal efficacy and long-term toxicity prevention.

Throughout her Fellowship, Dr. Wong was supervised by Dr. Deborah Levy and Dr. Linda Hiraki.




# **Spending**

Spending on programs increased to 70% in 2023 compared to 67% in 2022 with Research & Clinic Support being the largest program. Spending on Fundraising and Administration decreased in 2023 by 3% to 30% as a result of the office going virtual.



# Funds received from our generous donors and supporters:

Our largest fundraiser continues to be the WALK for Lupus Ontario and raised an amazing \$157,263 compared to the prior year amount of \$88,983, an increase of almost 77%. This huge success was reflected by the enthusiastic participation of the community at in-person events. Research Donations and Grants also increased as a result of more corporate grants being submitted and corporate recognition of Lupus Ontario research initiatives. Investment Income improved due to better market conditions this year compared to the prior year; which had a market crash as a result of higher interest rates and inflation combined with a worsening economy. The increased donations, sponsorships and grants collected permitted us to increase expenditures on research initiatives and support programs in the 2023 year.
